## WHAT IS INTERPERSONAL VIOLENCE?

"Interpersonal violence includes child maltreatment, intimate partner violence, sexual violence, youth violence and elder abuse. It takes place in the home, on the streets and in other public settings, in the workplace and in institutions such as schools, hospitals and residential care facilities." —World Health Organization

# WHAT IS DOMESTIC VIOLENCE?

"Domestic violence can happen between people in a family, intimate partners, or other people who live in the same house. It includes hurting, threatening or putting someone down or making them afraid. It also includes trying to control them or make them do things. The abuse can get worse over time." —Oregon Department of Human Services

#### WHAT IS SEXUAL ASSAULT?

"Sexual assault takes many forms including attacks such as rape or attempted rape, as well as any unwanted sexual contact or threats. Usually a sexual assault occurs when someone touches any part of another person's body in a sexual way, even through clothes, without that person's consent. Assailants can be strangers, acquaintances, friends, or family members."
