

Reporting Sexual Assault: *NWNM Quick Guide to Personnel and Confidentiality Levels*

NWNM is committed to caring for survivors of sexual assault through responding to their needs, protecting their privacy, offering appropriate referrals and protecting their safety as well as the safety of the entire campus community.

In seeking support, survivors can expect the following levels of confidentiality when contacting NWNM personnel.

When a student reports sexual assault (anonymously or not) to the following personnel, she or he can expect the complaint to be:	Confidentiality Level	Reported to Student Services personnel	Reported to Safety and Security	Reported to Title IX Coordinator
Counselor in Counseling Services	Strictly	No	No	No

Faculty or staff	Mostly	No	No	Yes, may be given anonymously
Safety and Security personnel	Limited	Yes	N/A	Yes

Strictly Confidential

These conversations are wholly confidential and are anonymous unless the student elects otherwise.

Mostly Confidential

These conversations are kept as confidential as possible, but information about incidents of sexual misconduct must be shared with certain administrators and the Title IX coordinator so that the NyVM can take action if necessary to protect the safety of the student or larger college population. Any response will take into account the student's wishes to the greatest extent possible.

Limited Confidentiality

These conversations are confidential to the greatest extent possible, though information will be shared with relevant administrators and the Title IX coordinator. Any response will take into account the student's wishes to the greatest extent possible.
